EVENING HIGH SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Five absences are allowed for a full credit Evening High School course for any reason. Three absences are allowed for a half credit course. If a student exceeds these limits he/she will be dropped from the course .

The Brentwood Evening High School is a fully accredited school capable of issuing diplomas and transferring credits to other educational institutions. Courses are offered for two nights a week, fourteen weeks, for three hours and twenty minutes each session. Thus, ninety (90) hours of instruction completes full course requirements in one semester .

The Evening High School provides opportunities for students in day school to take additional courses for early graduation or to meet college requirements. It also gives students who are out of school an opportunity to complete diploma requirements. Those who have a diploma may wish to take additional subjects for personal, professional or academic reasons.

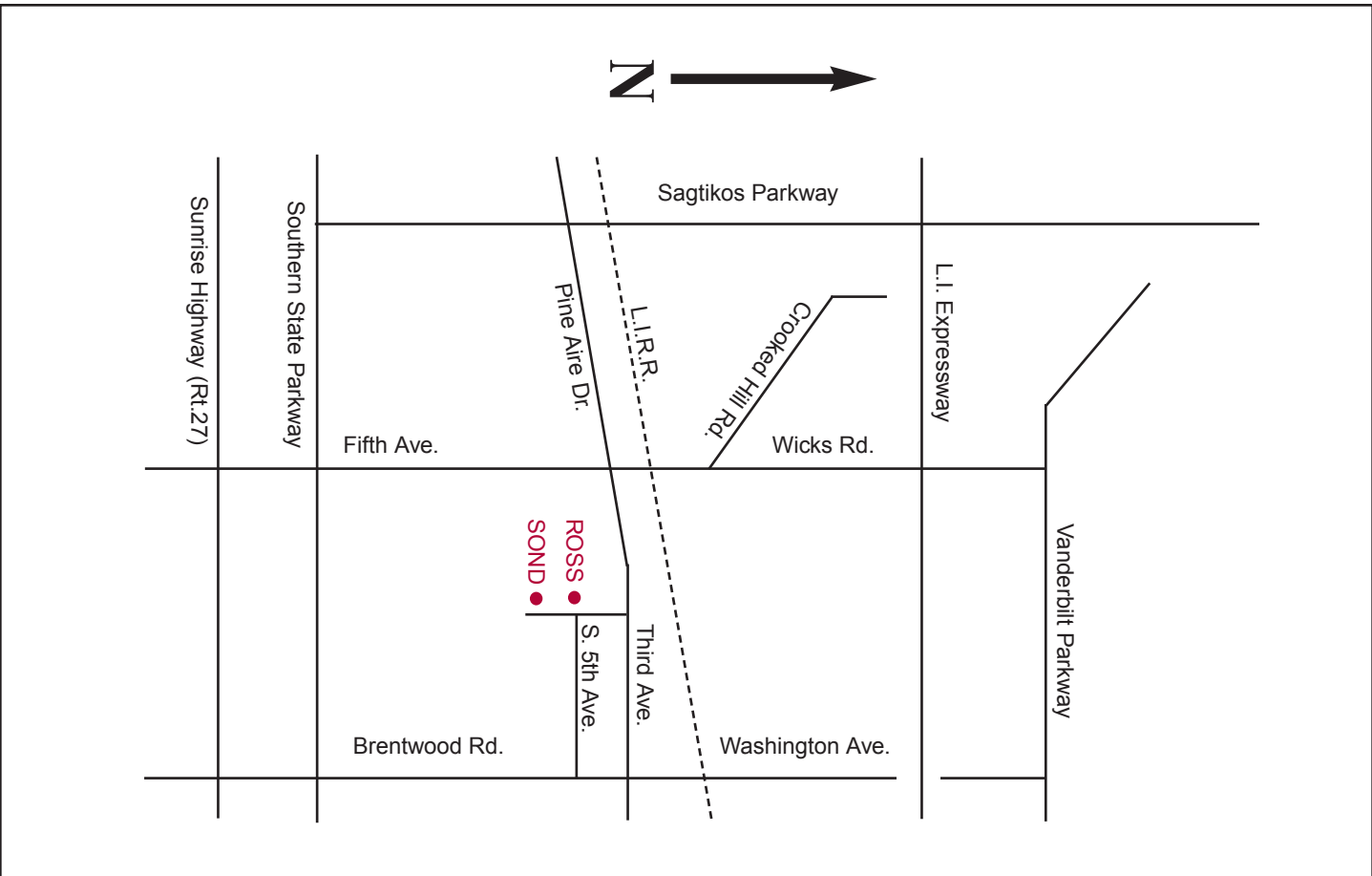
