WHEREAS, the Board of Education (the "Board") of the Brentwood Union Free School District (the "District") worked with a transportation safety consultant company ("Consultant") to conduct a Child Safety Zone Study pursuant to Section 3635-b of the Education Law to investigate whether a hazardous zone exists as defined in the statute and the accompanying regulations; and
